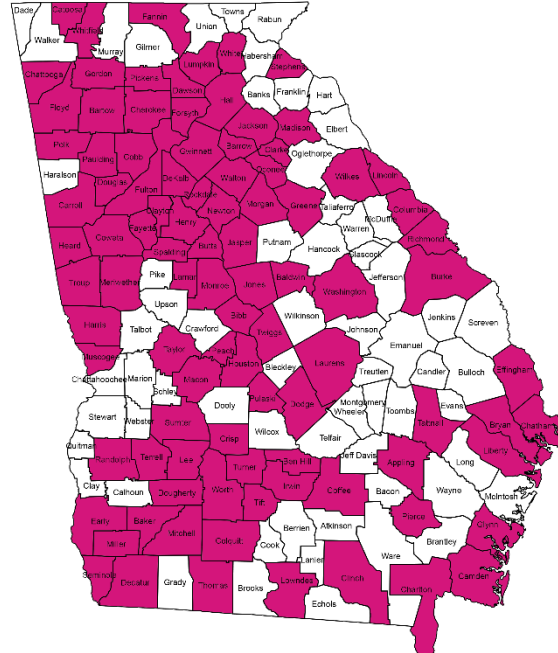

### Quarantine vs Isolation

While you may have heard these terms used interchangeably, they mean very different things. Quarantine is what happens when a person is not sick, who has **NOT** tested positive for the virus, separates him/herself by staying home or sheltering in place.

When a person has tested positive for COVID-19, whether they are well or sick, but do not need to be hospitalized, is placed in isolation, or should isolate from other household members and not go out into the public for any reason.
