

AMENDMENT TO THE HISTORIC PRESERVATION ORDINANCE

To amend Article XXI of Chapter 6 of the Douglas County Code of Ordinances regarding the historic preservation; and other purposes.

NOW THEREFORE, it is ordained that the Douglas County Code of Ordinances is hereby amended by deleting subsection (c) of the current 6-343 relating to the terms of members of the Tourism and Historic Commission and inserting in lieu thereof the following:

“Sec. 6-343(c). Commission members--Number, appointment, terms and compensation. The Commission shall consist of seven (7) members appointed by the board of commissioners. All members shall be residents of the county, and shall be persons who have demonstrated special interest, experience of education in history, architecture or the preservation of historic resources.


To the extent available in the county, at least three (3) members shall be appointed from among professionals in the disciplines of architecture, history, architectural history, planning, archaeology or related professions and at least one (1) member shall be appointed from among professionals in the disciplines of building construction or real property appraisal.


Members shall serve three-year terms. ~~Members may not serve more than two (2) consecutive terms.~~ In order to achieve staggered terms, initial appointments shall be: two (2) members for one (1) year; three (3) members for two (2) years; and two (2) members for three (3) years. Members shall not receive a salary, although they may be reimbursed for expenses.”


BE IT FURTHER ORDAINED that this ordinance shall become effective on 2/3/09, 2009.
