

President Ronald W. Reagan was the first to declare Nation Crime Victims' Rights Week in 1981. He wanted to reflect on the devastating impact of crimes on Victims and to strengthen our national resolve to ensure that Victims' needs are identified and addressed.

The theme for the 26th year of observance is "Crime Victims' Rights: Fairness. Dignity. Respect." The theme reminds us of the great strides we have made in giving victims a voice and the progress made in making sure that victims get fairness, dignity and respect.
